Intoduction

Although this report relates to the activity of the centre between April 2020 and March 2021, it will also raise issues that have occurred between that period and the time of writing. For all of the financial year 20/21, the restrictions of Covid 19 have been in place. This has impacted our activities and income as shown in the financial report. We have however continued to support our users who, at the time of writing, have largely returned.

Finance

As predicted in last year's report, our financial position was strong enough to withstand a year's loss of income. We are very grateful to Jane Preedy, our treasurer, for steering us through this difficult time.

Asset Transfer

Although Asset Transfer, is outside the timescale of this report, it is a most important matter on our agenda. In May 2021, we were approached by Milton Keynes Council with the news that they were planning to Asset Transfer the ownership of the Community Centre and Church to Campbell Park Parish Counci prior to the end of the current financial year. The matter was discussed in Council by Campbell Park who were of the view that, for a number of reasons, they did not want to pursue the matter at the present time. MKC then approached the Diocese of Oxford to see if they were interested and that is where the matter currently rests.

Improvements to the Building

Woolstone Community Centre committee take very seriously their responsibility to look after the building and are currently investigating the possibility of upgrading the toilets and redecorating the inside of the building.

Caretaking

We are delighted to report that Mary Sexton has joined our team as the Caretaker. She will be responsible for the management of bookings and the day-to-day running of the building
